Jared Grasso completed his seventh season and fifth as associate head coach at Iona College in 2016-17 after helping mentor the Gaels to 162-73 record during his time in New

Rochelle. The win total is the highest seven-year performance in the 70+ year history of the program. The team has also won back-to-back MAAC Championships.

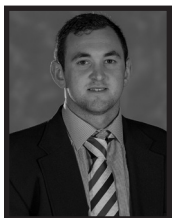
Hoop Scoop Online recognized Grasso as the 11th best non-super six conference assistant coach in the nation. RecruitDirt.com named Grasso the top Assistant coach in the MAAC for the 2011-12 season.

Prior to Iona, Grasso spent four years at Fordham University in the Bronx. In 2009-10, Grasso was named interim head men's basketball coach for the Rams five games into the season. At the time of his appointment, he was the youngest NCAA Division I head coach in the country.

Prior to Fordham, Grasso served as an assistant at Quinnipiac and Hartford as well as serving as a graduate assistant at Hofstra.

He was a four-year starter and two-year captain at Quinnipiac at shooting guard and earned a degree in mass communications in May 2002.

A native of Syosset, NY, Grasso attended St. Anthony's High School in Huntington Station.

Cooper Calzonetti joined the Iona College men's basketball staff as video coordinator

for the 2015-16 season and just completed his second season with the Gaels.

Calzonetti was a four-year career at Medaille College. The son of assistant coach Mark Calzonetti, he was a two-year team captain, appearing in 100 games while scoring 351 points in 13.8 minutes per game.

At Medaille, Calzonetti's teams appeared in two NCAA Division III Tournaments after winning Allegany Mountain Collegiate Conference championships. During his college career,

Calzonetti gained coaching experience assisting with summer basketball camps at Daemen, Medaille, Niagara, Rider, and St. Bonaventure. He's also worked well-known camps for The Hoop Groop, Five Star Basketball and the Bob Hurley Skills Camp.

HEAD COACH TIM CLUESS



Tim Cluess was named 12th head coach of the Iona College men's basketball program on Apr. 8, 2010 and completed his seventh season with the Gaels in 2016-17. Cluess came to New Rochelle with an impressive 20-year coaching resume after spending four seasons as head coach at C.W. Post in Brookville, NY.

One thing can be said about Cluess; he is a winner. After spending 14 years as head coach at St. Mary's High School in Manhasset, NY, Cluess

spent the five years prior to arriving at Iona in the college ranks at Suffolk Community College and C.W. Post. He amassed a 120-33 record and had unprecedented success at both schools. When combining his high school record, Cluess has won more than 74 percent of his games coached.

In seven seasons at Iona, Cluess has led the program to 162 wins, seven straight 20+ win campaigns and seven straight postseason appearances including a CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament championship game in 2011, back-to-back NCAA Tournaments in 2012 and 2013 as well as 2016 and 2017 and the National Invitation Tournament in 2014 and 2015. The Gaels won MAAC Regular Season Championships in 2012, 2014 and 2015 and were the MAAC Tournament Champions in 2013, 2016 and 2017. In 2011-12 - his second season in New Rochelle - Cluess led Iona to the program's first-ever at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament and just the second in the 30+ year history of the MAAC. Following the 2013-14 season he was named MAAC Coach of the Year.

Cluess has mentored talented performers such as Haggerty Award Winners and MAAC Players of the Year Lamont Jones (2013) and Scott Machado (2012). He has also coached the Gaels' second and third ever performers to score 1,000 points in less than two seasons, Mike Glover and Jordan Washington as well as the Maroon & Gold's all-time leading three-point scorer Sean Armand. Four of the five performers have gone on to play professionally and Armand, Glover and Jones have competed in the prestigious Portsmouth Invitational Tournament, a showcase for senior athletes looking to move on to the next level.

The exciting style of play that Cluess promotes led the Gaels to become the NCAA Division I Statistical Champion in four different categories including: points per game (2011-12 and 2012-13), assists per game (2011-12), three-point field goals per game (2013-14) and individual assists per game (Scott Machado, 2011-12).

Prior to his ascent to the college ranks, Cluess was a standout head coach at St. Mary's High School in Manhasset, NY from 1991-05, where the Gaels went a remarkable 264-78 (.772) during his tenure. St. Mary's won a record eight consecutive Nassau-Suffolk Catholic High School Athletic Association league championships from 1997-98 to 2004-05. In that final season with Cluess as their mentor, the Gaels went 25-1 and finished the season ranked in the Top 20 nationally after holding the No. 1 ranking for eight weeks of the campaign.

Cluess helped develop more than 50 players who moved on to the collegiate and professional ranks at St. Mary's including former North Carolina standout and current Cleveland Cavalier Danny Green. He won four state titles and two Federation championships at the Manhasset school.

Cluess played professional basketball in Europe and Australia after a collegiate career at both St. John's and Hofstra. He attended St. John's from 1978-81, before completing his coursework at Hofstra from 1982-83. Cluess, who holds a bachelor's degree in Accounting from Hofstra, currently resides in Floral Park, N.Y. with his wife, Karen, and their two children - Kevin, 19 and T.J., 18.
